INTERNATIONAL COOPERATION IN TIMES OF CRISIS: TOWARDS A NEW GEOPOLITICS OF DEVELOPMENT?

The Observatory for the Analysis of International Systems (OASIS), an indexed and peer-reviewed journal, currently invites submissions for its first edition of 2027 (OASIS No. 45). The theme for this issue will be: “International Cooperation in Times of Crisis: Towards a New Geopolitics of Development?”.

International Development Cooperation (IDC) is undergoing profound transformations. These range from institutional and normative contestation of its rules and institutions, to the decline of Official Development Assistance (ODA) flows, and the rise of emerging actors – both public and private – who introduce new forms and instruments of cooperation beyond its traditional architecture. All this unfolds in a scenario marked by shifting power dynamics and intensifying geopolitical competition.

These trends raise several pressing questions: Where is international development cooperation heading? Is there a need to explore new analytical and conceptual frameworks to understand these transformations? What issues shape today’s research agendas? How can new perspectives, actors, and practices – in line with local realities, national interests, and global public goods – be included? Are we truly witnessing a new geopolitics of development and cooperation? What role is played by the private sector or the rise of anti-globalist forces? And what is the role of the Global South?

- ◆ Articles may be written in Spanish, English, French, or Portuguese.
- ◆ Articles submitted to OASIS must not have been previously published.
- ◆ Articles must not exceed 9,000 words, single-spaced, Word format, Arial 12 pt, margins: top and bottom 2.5 cm; left and right 3.0 cm. This includes bibliography, notes, images or graphs, if applicable.
- ◆ References must follow APA style. For more information: <https://apastyle.apa.org/style-grammar-guidelines>

- ◆ Authors must include an abstract in English, Spanish, and the original language of the article (in case it is different from Spanish and English). OASIS can help with translating the abstract into Spanish or English in case the author does not speak these languages. The abstract must include the key elements of the article and must not be longer than two hundred and fifty (250) words. Four to five key words must also be included.
- ◆ Authors must provide: most recent academic degree and field, institutional affiliation, and e-mail address.

Interested authors must send a tentative title and an abstract of no more than 250 words to the journal's e-mail (oasis@uexternado.edu.co) no later than 20 April 2026.

Final version of the Article:

The final article must be submitted through the Open Journal System (OJS) available on our website (<https://www.uexternado.edu.co/oasis>) no later than 22 June 2026.

Book Reviews:

OASIS also welcomes reviews of recently published books (no more than two years old). Reviews may be written in Spanish, English, French or Portuguese and should be approximately 2,000 words. The deadline for submission via the OJS platform (<https://www.uexternado.edu.co/oasis>) is 22 June 2026.
